Pensioner in this case was killed in an air raid on Belfast on the 15/16 April 1941, and the burial expenses were met by the City Authorities (see letter dated 8th ultimo from notes of this). In the Circs. a direction is sought as to whether we may pay arrears of pension to his brother, Mr Wm. J. Donnelly in the absence of accepted bill for funeral expenses.

In this case it is observed from the Death Certificate that the condition of Deceased pensioner is given as "married". It would be necessary therefore, to ascertain whether his widow and/or children are still living. Also claimant states that he paid £10 in respect of rent whereas the

period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921, and (in addition),

- (b) who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, and
- (c) who is not a person to whom the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, applies

(2) Where a person who is not a person to whom the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, applies, and who is not a person to whom by virtue of the preceding sub-paragraph the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, applies, has either:—

- (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or,
- (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921, the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing sub-paragraph, applies to such person, and such person may accordingly, apply for a service certificate.

(3) The Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, shall be deemed not to apply to a person to whom that Act in fact applies, but in respect of whom the Minister is satisfied either that because of such person having served in the Forces as defined below, he did not apply for a certificate of military service under the said Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, or that such person was refused such certificate because of his having been sentenced to imprisonment or penal servitude in respect of an act done by him in the execution of his duty as a member of the Forces.

2. SERVICE IN THE FORCES:—

For the purpose of paragraph 1 above, a person shall be deemed to have been serving in the Forces while such person was rendering active service in any of the bodies which constitute the Forces, and, in the case of a person who served as a member of the Irish Volunteer Executive or of the Headquarters Staff of Oglaihn na h-Eireann (Irish Republican Army), or in the Intelligence Branch of any of the bodies which constitute the Forces, while such person was so serving.

3. THE FORCES:—

the receipt is for £4:10/- only. Letters of Admrs. would appear to be called for as the amount payable is fairly large. There are other similar cases of recent date (Donnellan) but the amounts were small.

NOTE.—(a) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds), or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment."

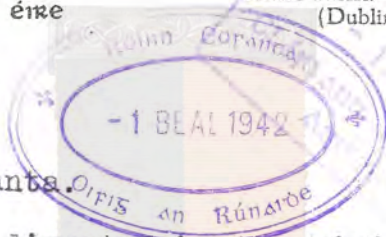

I am directed by the Minister for Defence to state that a Service Certificate under Section 10(2) of the Act has been granted in the case of Hugh Donnelly (deceased) of Ballymascanlon, Dundalk, Co. Louth, based on the findings of the Referee, as contained in his report which is attached.

The Minister now proposes, with the sanction of the Minister for Finance, and in accordance with the terms of Section 11 of the Act, to grant a pension and to pay the legal personal representative of the late Hugh Donnelly the accumulated arrears of pension for the period from the 1st October, 1934, to the date of death. The details of the pension are as follows:-
