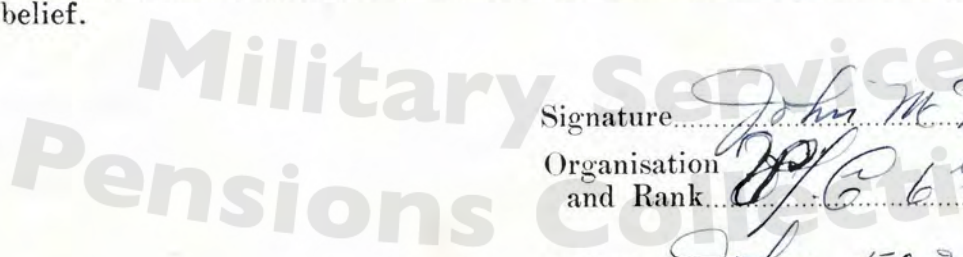

Gentlemen:

Herewith I submit answers to questions on your Forms (Reference Nos. IRB-2853).

(1) Place of engagement was Knockahople (Farrell's house) in 5th Batt. area, No. 1 Tipp. Brigade; date, November 2, 1922. J. Sheehy V/C Tipp. No. 1 Brigade, P. Hughes and Jim Murphy, 5th Batt. members were my companions. Sheehy was killed later in the fight. P. Hughes is in U. S. A. His address is 80 Diamond Street, Greenpoint, Brooklyn, New York, and Jim Murphy is somewhere in England; his address is unknown to me. We were surrounded in abovementioned house during a heavy snow storm at day-break, rushed through undressed and fought a retreat over three miles of mountain, until I was carried away in a semi-conscious condition owing to three hours exposure and loss of blood. I was badly injured in the left foot at the outset, second toe being broken, and wound through flesh and sole of left foot. I was treated by Doctor McCormack of Doon, County Limerick who died soon after.

(2) Being carried from place to place at night to avoid capture I developed rheumatic fever at the end of November and was treated by Doctor David Coffey of Newport, County Tipperary. I have since failed for all jobs requiring a medical examination on account of my heart.

(3) Medical certificates are enclosed as to present condition and past treatments with the exception of Doctor McCormack's, as he is dead.

(4) Question as to imprisonment answered on Form AP50-5.

(5) Served in A. S. U. and Staff work from October, 1920 to Truce, 1921 and from July, 1922 to April, 1923. Any person attached to Tipp. No. 1 Brigade at the time can corroborate. I specifically mention P. Hughes, John McLoughlin and Tom McGrath whose addresses I give on Form IRB-2853.

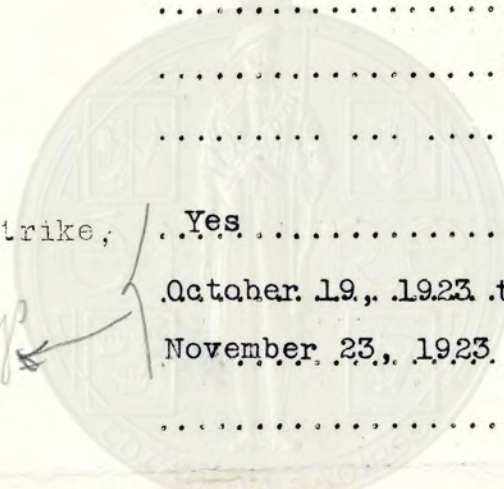
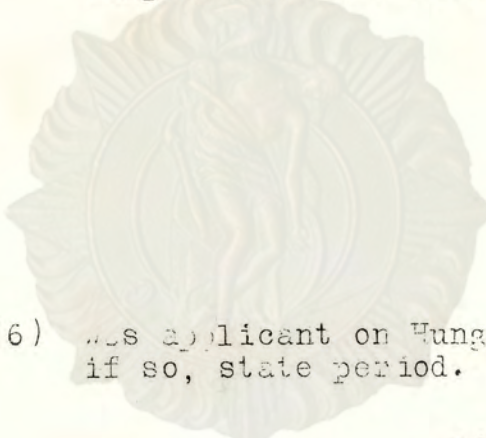
