



PARAGRAPH (1) OF RULES 4: "..... a pensions declaration shall be made before a person who is not the pensioner or the wife or husband of the pensioner of the declarant and who -

- (a) in case the pension declaration is made in the State, is a person whose name is on the register of Dail electors, or
- (b) in case the pensions declaration is made outside the State, is a person of one of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to these Rules".







(2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.


