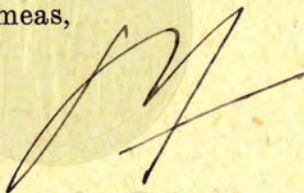

1. I am an applicant for
a Military Service Pension
and I desire to have my
Case re opened on the
following grounds:-

Additional evidence is now
available that I could not
get before and it will naturally
affect my claim.

When my case was before
the Military Service Pensions
Board I had no evidence
about an ambush which took
place at the Railway Tunnel
near Westport on March 14th
1921. Joseph Doherty who was
with me in this ambush is
in America. At the time my
Case was heard Edward
Murray of Westport who was
also with me in this
ambush was interned in the
Curragh. Mr Murray at that
time would not give evidence
before any Court or Board.
Mr Murray has since
been released and is
now prepared to give
evidence on my behalf as
to my part in this ambush
on the 14 March 1921 on

the black & Tans.

I also took part in another ambush in Newpost on the 14th May 1921. In this attack an R. I. C. man named Butler was shot dead. Mr Murray was also with me in this attack and can give material evidence that may assist the Board in my case.

Outside my ordinary duties as 1st lieutenant I was continually doing duty for the A. S. U. guarding them while they rested. I was specially sent back by Mr Michael Mulvey from the A. S. U. owing to the importance of my work. Early in 1921 my house was raided by the black & Tans and they caught me and gave me a very bad beating. They put a can on top of my head - riddled it with bullets and wrecked my horse. As a result I had to leave home and stay in a dug out for the rest of the pre-trial period. I continued my operations from the dug-out.

I was on duty at Filmeena Ambush and I took James Swift and "Joe" Hughes who were wounded to Pat Cawley's house about 3 miles away where Dr J. A. Madden dressed them. I was in poor health when I filled my form and went before the Board

Since the beating I received I have been very deaf and my nerves have been very bad. I did not understand the importance of having my form carefully prepared with a full account of my activities.

The following men can give a full account of the foregoing.

Dr J. A. Madden Baggot St Dublin
Edward Murray Newport Colway
Eamon Moane Carrabawn Westport
Michael Gallagher James St Westport

I John Kelly of Gortnaclassa, Clogher, Westport in the County of Mayo do hereby most solemnly and sincerely declare as follows:-

1. The following is a summary of my additional evidence:-

I took part in an ambush at the Railway Tunnel Newport on the 17th March 1921. In this engagement an R.I.C. man named Butler was shot. I was continually under arms during this period when we blocked the Castlebar-Newport Road at Brocagh after this ambush and blew up bridges at Cuilmore Gurteen and Derrynaraw and other places in the vicinity in preparation for the Kilmeena ambush. I took part in the Kilmeena ambush and took two wounded men named James Swift and Thomas Hughes to Pat Cawley's house at Gortnaclassa where they were dressed by Dr. J.A. Madden. After the Truce I held the rank of Company Captain and took part in the fight at Gallaghers Brocagh on the 1st November 1922. Pat Mulchrone was killed at this engagement and Anthony Keane wounded. I was also continually cutting communications during this period. Both before and after the Truce my house was a Despatch Station as it was central between Newport Westport and Castlebar areas. It was raided several times and searched. I also got 2 rifles and ammunition in 1922 in Westport from Peter Corcoran of Kiltyroe Kilmeena who was an officer in the Free State Army. I had them in a dump which I was in charge of at Gortnaclassa and ultimately they were handed over to Dominick Mulchrone who was Quartermaster of our area.

2. The following will give evidence on my behalf:-

- (a) Ned Murray of Rossnarubble, Newport, Co. Mayo.
- (b) Dominick Mulchrone, Aughagowla, Clogher, Westport, Co. Mayo.
- (c) Michael Gallagher, James' Street, Westport.
- (d) William O'Malley and William Bourke of Main Street,

Newport who were beside me at the Railway Tunnel engagement
O'Malley was beside me at Kilmeena ambush.

(e) Dr. J.A. Madden, Baggot Street, Dublin.

(f) I understand that Messrs Moane and Kilroy already gave
evidence in my case.

3. It is only now that the evidence of Ned Murray is available.
He refused to take a pension himself until recently and is only
out of gaol about 12 months. He has now changed his views and
is prepared to give evidence in my case. I was not aware that
I was entitled to call any of the other witnesses. I understood
that we were confined to the witnesses called by the State.

4. See 3. above. Ned Murray was most familiar with my
activities being with me at the Railway Tunnel ambush and at
Kilmeena ambush. Owing to his former political views his
evidence was only now become available.

5. I make this Declaration conscientiously believing same to
be true and by virtue of the Statutory Declaration Act 1938.
