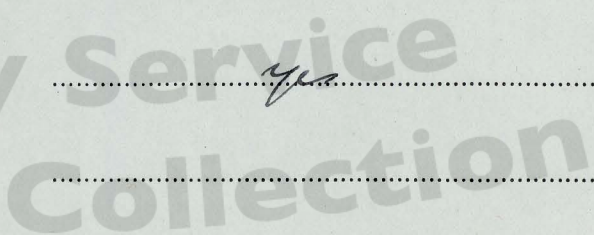

The Board having considered this case found that the death of the deceased was due to gunshot wound attributable to military service in O'Laughlin's Bureau (9K2) and that applicant was partially dependant on the deceased.

The Board are however unable to recommend the award of a Special Dependents allowance having regard to the statutory conditions laid down in Sec 37 (3) (d), 1937 act.

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
