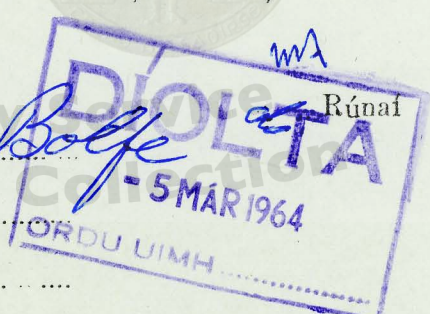

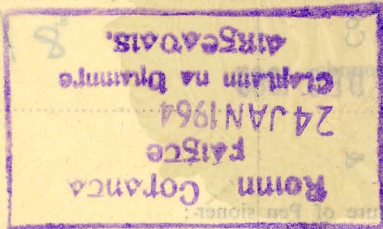

With reference to the representations of the Minister for Social Welfare on behalf of Mr. John Balfe, 28 Shannon Hill, Enniscorthy, regarding the non-payment for the period 1st July, 1954, to 30th November, 1954, of the special allowance awarded to him under the Army Pensions Acts, the Minister for Defence desires me to say that payment of Mr. Balfe's allowance was withheld pending the presentation for payment at this Department of the warrant issued to him in respect of the month of June, 1954. The latter warrant contained a form of declaration which the payee was required to complete as evidence that he is alive. It is the practice to withhold subsequent payments until such evidence is received in this Department.

A warrant for £27.1.8d. in payment of his allowance for the period in question has been issued to Mr. Balfe, who should ensure that, in future, warrants, particularly those in respect of the quarter months, are presented promptly through a bank for payment.

I am to add that Mr. Balfe was awarded a pension of £8.11.5d. per annum on the 10th February, 1945, under the terms of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934. In accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Military Service Pensions (Amendment) Act, 1953, his pension was increased by 50% to £12.17.2d. per annum with effect from 1st January, 1953. Payment on foot of this award is being made quarterly to Mr. Balfe and he has been paid up to and including the 30th September, 1954.



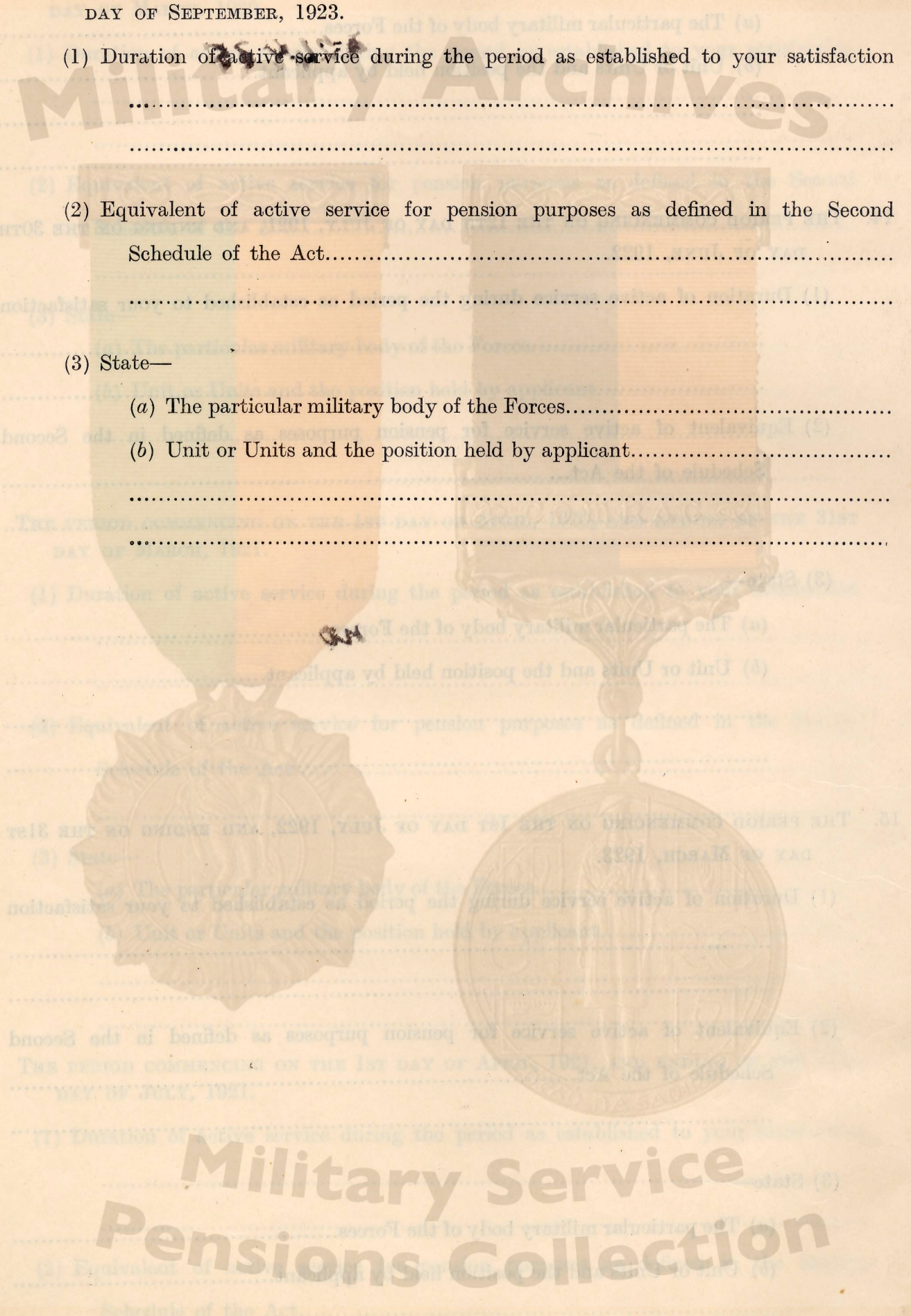
