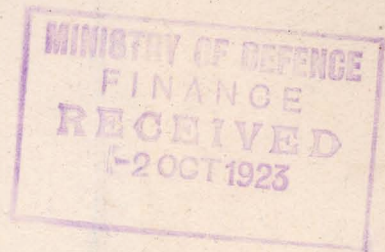

Sir

I understand from the Ministry of Defence that the claim of my client Mr Michael Nolan of this town in connection with the loss of his son Volunteer Thomas Nolan who was killed in an attack by Irregular Forces at Ballymakeera in the County of Cork on the 5th December 1922 has been forwarded to you for attention. If you have all the correspondence before you you will sufficiently understand the present circumstances of my client who is practically destitute and who has not yet received any compensation whatever in respect of the death of his son.
