Civic Guard report states the father of the deceased viz:-Daniel O'Connor, Railway Cottages, Killorglin, is employed by the G.S.W.R. Company on the Permanent Way at the pay of £2.5.8. per fortnight with a house free of rent. He is apparently over 70 years of age, and is employed by the Railway Company for about 35 years, with various alterations in his salary during this time. this time. He appears old and feeble, and it seems he will not

be much longer able to work. His wife, Mary O'Connor, is in delicate health for a considerable number of years past.

The deceased, Denis O'Connor, prior to joining the National Army, had also been employed on the G.S.W.R. doing ordinary labouring work on the Permanent Way. In the year 1921 his weekly wages were £2.7.6. per week, and I had been informed that he contributed about £2. each week to his parents.

The applicants "Daniel and Mary O'Connor" were only partially dependent on their son, Denis, but he had been the only son from whom they derived any benefit. Applicants are not known to have enjoyed any private income prior to the death of their son. In my opinion this man, Daniel O'Connor, may be disqualified from working on the Railway at any moment, owing to his old age; which means for him no means of support from any source.

The deceased, Denis O'Connor, was killed on the 27th Sept. 1922 at Killorglin in an engagement which took place between the

Free State Troops and Irregulars.


