The D.M.P. Report states that the applicant is a widow living with her daughter on whom she is depending for partial support at the address given. She is in receipt of an allowance of 14/- weekly in respect of her son, Michael O'Neill, who is now serving in the National Army. These two sources of Income form her main support. While in the Army deceased gave her no weekly allowance but contributed small sums of money towards her support on a few occasions.

In the circumstances it is clear that the Applicant's dependancy on her son at the time of his death for support and maintenance was only partial.

The applicant has no private income nor has she been in any

regular employment.

She has four children living. Frederick 30 years, married, carpenter - Mary 28 years, single, tailoress. - Michael 24 years, National Soldier, wounded, in St. Bricin's Hospital - Patrick 22 years ex-National Soldier labourer unemployed.
