SUBJECT:- Private Michael McDonnell, Deceased.

The above named was killed in action on St. Stephen's night last while carrying out a raid on a house occupied by Irregulars.

His personal property, to my knowledge was a pocket watch, worth about ten shillings, with a pocket wallet containing £1. I sent on the watch and £1. note to his people by post, but never got a reply to let me know if they received same. I still have the wallet in my trunk as there are some photos in it of deceased and myself. I mean to call that way when going home on leave. This is all I know of the case. I am also writing to deceased's people enquiring if they received the articles.
