The Secretary of the St. Vincent de Paul Society states that the applicant Mrs. Mary Anne Flynn, was practically wholly dependent on the deceased owing to his position as Manager of the Spirit Business of the applicant at 3 Gt. George's Street, Belfast. Applicant had no private income apart from that obtained from the Spirit Business as a result of the deceased's labours prior to his death. The following are the applicant's other children: - Anna, 25 years - assists in the business since her brother (deceased) joined the National Army. 

N.B.—" If any person with a view to obtaining a grant or payment of a pension, allowance, or gratuity under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application, or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts, to a fine not exceeding five pounds."
