Report as to dependency of Applicant or of the motherless children upon

Deceased at the time of his death.

The Civic Guard Report states that the applicant resides with two sisters and one brother at Pouladuff Road. She has not as far as I could learn been in receipt of any private income prior to the death of her brother Jeremiah. Both parents of the Desmonds are dead and since the death of her mother three years ago, Hannah Desmond has not been employed. Previous to that time she was employed as a dressmaker in a City firm and was paid 20/- a week. She is lame as a result of an accident some years hence; but is not incapacitated from earning thereby. The family originally consisted of five brothers and three sisters. Four of the brother are living and of these one 27 years is a corporation labourer and Four of the brothers is in receipt of £3.12.6 per week of which he contributes 30/to applicant. A second brother 25 years is in the District Asylum, as a result of shell-shock during the European War. The applican receives 5/- a week from the British Authorities through this man. The applicant The third brother, 29 years is married and the fourth 35 years is a Merchant sailor who has not been heard of since his mother's death. The fifth brother was deceased, Jeremiah. The two sisters residing

The fifth brother was deceased, Jeremiah. The two sisters residing with applicant aged 16 and 18 years are not employed.

Prior to his joining the National Army, Jeremiah Desmond, was a steward on the Cork Steampacket Co's "S.S. Bandon". There he earned on an average £3.0.0. per week, which figure I have ascertained from an official of that Company, would represent the average weekly wage of a steward at that period. Of this sum £2 per week

was given to applicant.

The Desmond family appear to be in poor circumstances

and at present depend solely on the earnings of one brother and the small British Allowance of 5/- per week. I have interviewed a local gentleman named Buckley, a farmer, as to the accuracy of the facts ascertained from Miss Desmond, and he has stated them to be true as far as he knew. I believe that at the time of Jeremiah Desmond's death the family were partially dependent on him and have I believe suffered to a considerable extent by his death.
