~~Civic Guard~~ Report states that Mrs. Margaret McClaren or Lynn, who is a widow, resides with the three members of her family, aged 19, 17 and 10 years respectively, in a two apartment house at 16 Nisbet St. Parkhead, Glasgow. Her two eldest children are unemployed, and the youngest is suffering from infantile paralysis. The only income is what Mrs. Lynn can earn by keeping boarders. The rent of the house is £4.9.3d per quarter.

This woman's husband died on 3rd. July 1921. At that time her son, the late soldier, was a mechanic in Parkhead Forge, and in receipt of £5 per week, out of which he assisted his mother. During his service in the National Forces he contributed from £1 to 30/- per week towards his mother's support.

Mrs. Lynn is a sober and industrious woman, and nothing is known to the police against her character. Her husband did not leave her any means when he died, and since then she has had a struggle to support her family. She did not enjoy any private income or hold any regular employment prior to the death of her husband or the late soldier, and the officer who interviewed her formed the opinion that she was wholly dependent dependent on the allowance she received from her son.
