Report as to dependency of Applicant or of the motherless children upon Deceased at the time of his death.

" The Applicant Mrs. Catherine Burke, 48 years of age, resides at 10 Lower Erne St. and is mother of the late Lieutenant Charles Burke. She lives with her husband Thomas Burke in a three roomed cottage for which they pay £1 per week. They have seven in family living with them, viz., Florrie, 22 years, earning nil, Eva, 19 years earning nil, Thomas 18 years, earning £1 per week, Patrick 16 years, earning nil, Eileen 12 years, Gladys 9 years - schoolgirls, and James 4 years. The husband works with his own horse and cart and earns on an average about £3 per week exclusive of the keep of his horse.

The Applicant states that prior to her son, Charles, joining the Army, he was employed as a Commercial Traveller, and gave her £3 per week. She keeps the house and has no private means, and has not now or had not at any time, any regular employment. Applicant was partially dependant on Deceased.
