Over 14 months ago I lodged an application under the Army Pensions Act, 1932, on behalf of Miss Agnes Gallagher, (Cumann na mBan), Bridge Street, Westport, Co. Mayo, and we have since been anxiously awaiting developments.

Up to the present there has been no tangible result, and as the lady in question has been seriously ill, it has occurred to those interested in her that if something is not done very soon the case, I fear, will automatically settle it self.

From making comparisons, instituting private enquiries, and piecing things together, it has been evolved that the abnormal delays experienced by applicants are occasioned in circumstances which might be considered outside your control, inasmuch as references furnished by the claimants fail to reply to communications addressed to them by your Department.

In cases of this description when a claimant applies for information as to how his or her case is progressing, the reply, we understand, usually furnished is to the effect that investigation is proceeding.

If such a "snag" is the cause of the delay in Miss Gallagher's case, I would respectfully suggest that she be made aware of same, and we will, if possible, take steps at our end to have the matter immediately investigated and remedied without delay.

This, I aubmit, would be the businesslike way of approaching and attacking the problem, as if the persons furnished as references do not, or will not, supply the information asked for by your Department after repeated "refreshers", it is merely flogging a dead horse to keep on writing to them, and manifestly some other method should be adopted if progress is to be made and justice done to the claimants.

You will agree, I feel sure, that Miss Gallagher has good grounds for appealing to you direct, as owing to the unreasonable delay in dealing with her case she has a well founded grievance. This warrants prompt and appropriate action which we confidently feel will be taken by you forthwith.

The Minister for Defence desires me to refer to your minute of the 25th ultimo, in connection with the claim, under the Army Pensions Acts, of Miss Agnes Gallagher, Bridge Street, Westport, and to say that it is not proposed to amend the Army Pensions Acts in respect of the degree of disability entitling an applicant to a pension.

I am to add that Miss Gallagher was informed on the 11th February, 1935, that no award could be made to her under the Acts as she was found to be suffering from no disability attributable to military service, at the date of her medical examination by the Army Pensions Board.

The Minister has fully reviewed the findings in the case but much regrets he can see no reason for a departure from the decision reached.
