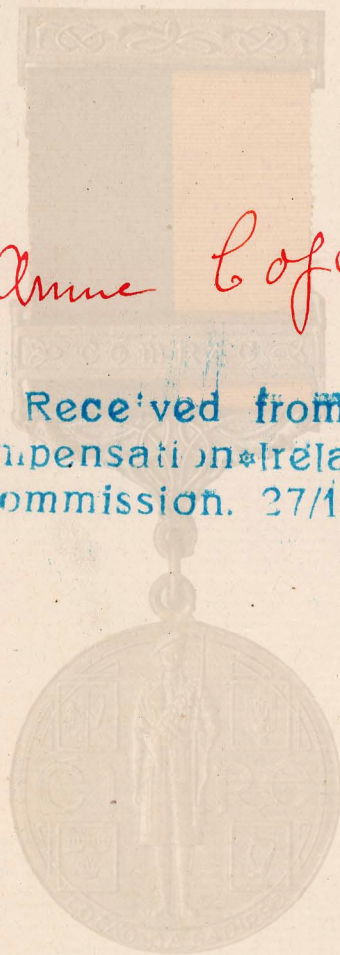

rades got away with
slight wounds bringing
him in the car with
them some of the
military was badly
wounded also

I am sorry to have to again trouble you about the claim I sent you some time ago, on account of the death of my son, but the person who wrote the letter for me misunderstood me. I intended to put in a claim for one thousand pounds and I also wished to state that he was killed while doing police duty. This I wish to do so now and hope you will send me an acknowledgment of having received this claim. I do not see why the Irish police should not be as well compensated as those who did the work of the British Government.
