Applicant had no private income prior to death of deceased and was solely dependent on him for her sustenance combined with the produce of her small farm.

The Applicant is in a delicate state of health partially due to shock resultant on the death of her son.

The applicant was wholly dependent on deceased and is worthy of the king consideration of the Government.
