I wish to make a claim to your
Committee for compensation for the loss of my husband James
Henry Doyle, who died from wounds received through the accidental
discharge of his revolver at his home 13 Parliament St. He
joined the Irish Volunteers in 1914. He took part in the rising
and was interned until the general amnesty. He was on active
service up to the time of the truce, holding the rank of 1st
Lieut in 3 Coy. 5th Batt. Engineers. He did not sever his
connection with them and was still actively engaged when his death
occurred.

I have one child, born 4 months after my

husband's death, and is now 14 months old, I have been in receipt of £ per month from the Irish White Cross which I will receive until my baby is 16 yrs. old or until I receive compensation when I will have to refund the amount paid me by the White Cross. Of course I have had to work before & since my baby was born.

I have never claimed compensation through the ordinary medium of the courts, but am doing so now to your Committee, hoping it will receive your kind consideration.
