The Civic Guard Report states that the applicant did not enjoy private income or held any regular employment prior to the death he deceased. She is the mother of the deceased and is advanced of the deceased. in years and in poor health; she possesses one acre of untilled land (bog) the rates of which is £2 per annum and the rent of her cottage is 1/2d per week. She has four children living - two boys and two girls - Patrick, Martin, Bridget and Mary whose ages are respectively 27 years, 26½ years, 28 years and 20 years. The two boys are farm labourers and are working for a Mr. Fitzgerald of Knockyelan, Kilrossanty, the two girls are at business in Millinery Shops - one in Dungarvan and the other in Waterford. The boys earn about 12/-per week each, and the girls 14/- and 10/- per week, respectively Patrick contributes about 10/- per week towards the upkeep of the house, the others give applicant a little money from time to time.


