Personal Injuries. Amount Claimed £1000.

Applicant is a farmer residing at Drumgarriff. On the 19th. May 1921 Royal Irish Constabulary came to his house and questioned his sons James and John. Other boys were taken away from the neighbourhood that day. James was afraid they would come again and take him away so he left home. At Skirdagh on the 22nd. May 1921 James was shot by the Police and died within 24 hours. James was 21 years of age and the eldest son at home. He did ~~me~~ practically all the farm work for applicant.
