Civic Guard Report states that the John Dooley son of Joseph Dooley, Knockbrown was killed at Wellington Bridge, Co. Wexford, whilst on active service with the National Army in the month of March 1923. He had served 18 months in National Army and had joined up at the age of 19 years. Previous to hisjoining the National Army he was in I.K.A. and was employed in the Gravel pit at Knockbrown receiving a weekly wage of £2.10-0 from the G.S.& W.Rly. His father Joseph Dooley resides in a railway cottage at Knockbrown, and is employed by G.S.& W.Rly in the Gravel pit. He is 56 years of age and does not expect to hold this employment much longer, as he is not as robust in health as heretofore. When he is not able to work in the pit he will have to vacate the cottage to make room for the new hand. His other son ismarried and has a large family to look after and unless a decent pension is granted the old man, he will have no alternative but go to the County Home at some date in the near future. In my opinion the Applicant would be wholly dependent on his son John, had the latter lived.

Further Report:-

Claimant's wife is dead 16 years. Claimant is the tenant of the Rly. Cottage in which he resides with his remaining son and the latter's wife and two children, and tries to contribute to the upkeep of the household.
