I am directed by the Hinister for Defence to inform you that Michael Gallagher may properly be regarded as having been a supporter of the Irish side in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 4 (a) of the "Heads of Working Arrangements" (C.P. 3648).

The Minister is not aware of any objection to the consideration of the case with a view to immediate payment.
