The Board having considered this case found that the death of deceased was due to disease attributable to his three military service in England in Germany (D.R.A.) The Board are of opinion that applicant was partially dependant on the deceased & recommend that a gratuity of £112-10 (one hundred & twelve pounds, 10/-) be awarded.
