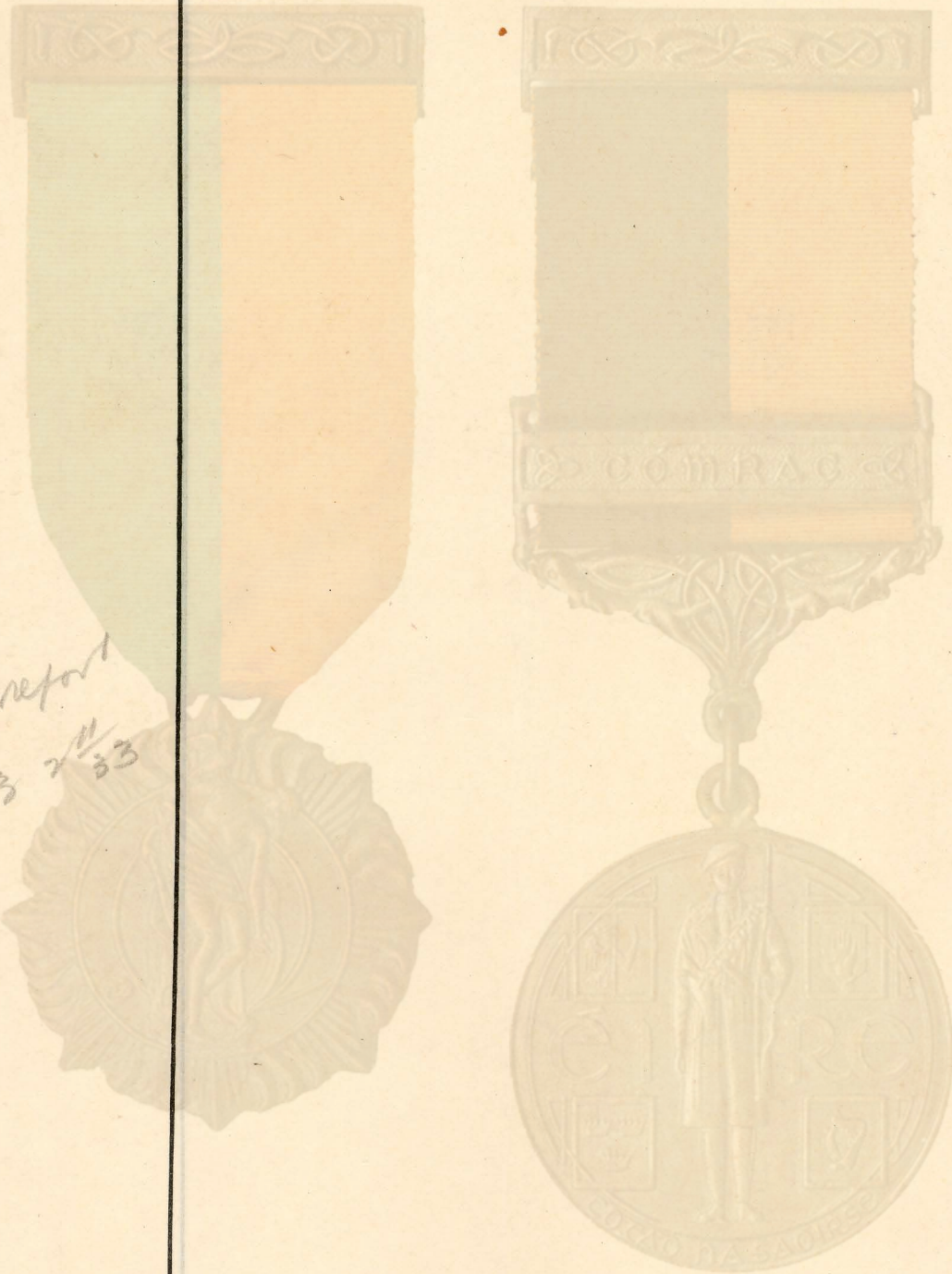

I am directed by the Army Pensions Board to state that they have under consideration a claim under the Army Pensions Acts from Mr. Michael Rouse, Bellindangan Mitchelstown, Co.Cork, in respect of his son Michael, who died on the 1st September 1922. It is stated that the deceased received a gunshot wound in the chest or shoulder on the 18th August 1922 and that he was taken to the Richmond Hospital where he died on the 1st September 1922, the certified cause of death being Pyaemia, Cardiac failure.

The Board will be very much obliged if you will kindly state from your records whether the gunshot wound referred to was the cause of the Pyaemia, or, if not, what was the cause.
