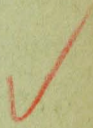

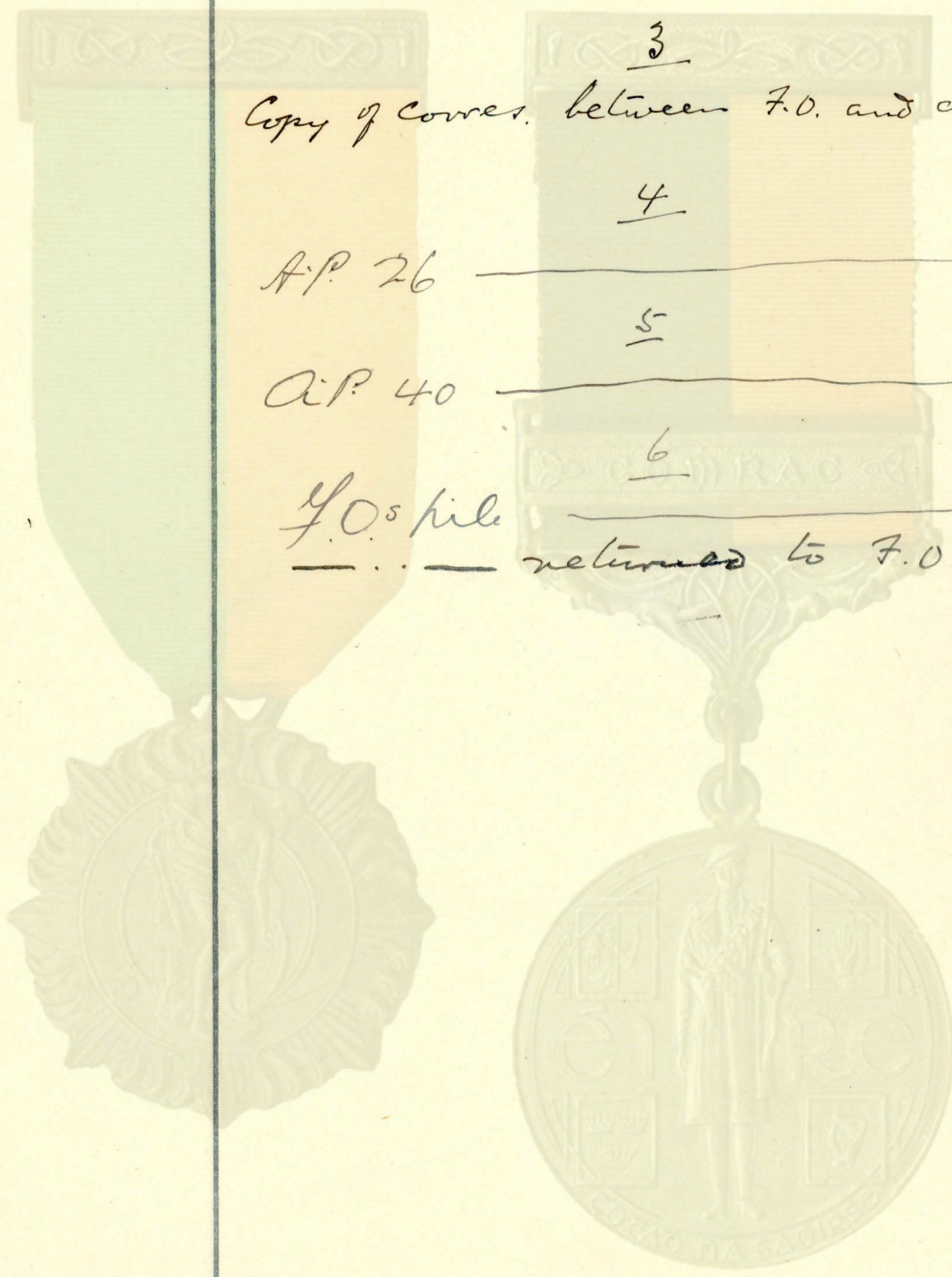

Your report should also include the following particulars:-

- (1) Whether the deceased was a member of the Irish Volunteers, ~~or Irish Citizen Army~~, or National Army.
- (2) If a member of the Irish Volunteers ~~Irish Citizen Army, 1916,~~ the rank in the forces which most closely corresponds to the rank in the Irish Volunteers ~~Irish Citizen Army, 1916,~~ held by the deceased.
- (3) If a member of the National Army, the date of his attestation and discharge should be given, together with the rank held on discharge.
- (4) Whether in your opinion the disability which resulted in death was attributable to service in:-
 - (a) The Irish Volunteers, ~~or Irish Citizen Army~~, or
 - (b) National Army, ~~or~~
 - (c) The Irish Volunteers, ~~or Irish Citizen Army~~ and the National Army.
- (5) That the disability which resulted in death was not due to any serious negligence or misconduct on the deceased's part.

Please attach with your reply a copy of the deceased's Medical History Sheet. and copy of Discharge Medical Board proceedings (if any).
