Walsh Elizabeth An application has been made under the above Act by *Castletown St. Westport* for a Pension or Gratuity in respect of wound or injury stated to have been received by him/her while engaged in Military Service with *Oglaigh na hÉireann (ORA)* in the period 1922-1923.

Your name having been given as Commanding Officer in the period covered by the application, the Board will be obliged if you will facilitate them in dealing with the claim by replying, without delay, to the queries set out overleaf.

I am to point out that, for the purposes herein, a person shall be deemed to have been engaged in Military Service when, but only when, he was on duty as a member of the organisation referred to, or was under arrest as a result of his activities as such member, or being such member was evading capture or pursuit by the armed forces of the British Government or of the Government of Saorstát Éireann or of the Provisional Government or of the Government of Northern Ireland, or being such member was detained in a prison or ship, or an internment camp by or by order of any of the said Governments.




